

Our **Youth, Family & Community Outreach Services** stabilize families in crisis, ensure runaways are safe and divert at risk youth from crime.

94.8% of the runaways we served in **Crisis Intervention** are back home with their families.

Our **System of Care Program** prevented the moves of 85.7% of the children at risk of having to change foster homes.

80% of the youth served in our **Home Confinement Program** completed their plans successfully and avoided juvenile detention.



Our **Foster Care Program** reunites parents with their children when they take the steps to ensure their well-being, or finds children forever families through adoption. In FY14, we helped **261** children achieve the dream of a lasting, safe, and caring family through reunification or adoption.



Our **New Day Senior Program** provides in-home counseling and volunteer companion services to older adults to address issues such as grief and depression, and prevent costly nursing home care. Last year, **98%** of the seniors served through

In-Home Counseling and 95% of those served by our Friendly Visitor Program were able to continue living independently.

It is our goal to ensure that every child we serve has a forever family. In FY14, our **Adoption Program** contributed to this effort by placing 186 children with loving adoptive families.

Parents in our **Intact Family Program** learn to improve their parenting skills and make lasting changes that will help them provide their children a safe and nurturing home.

By engaging in our services, 81.6% of the families we served avoided the foster care system.
