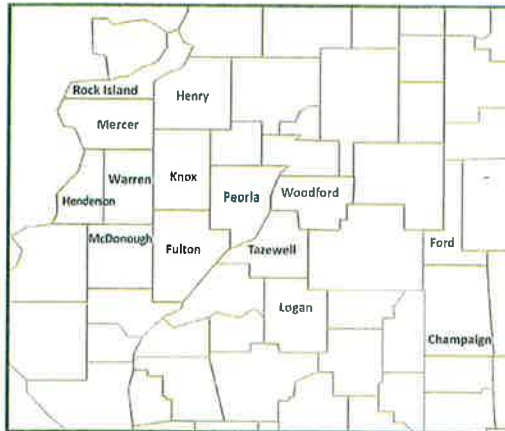




Counties we Serve.

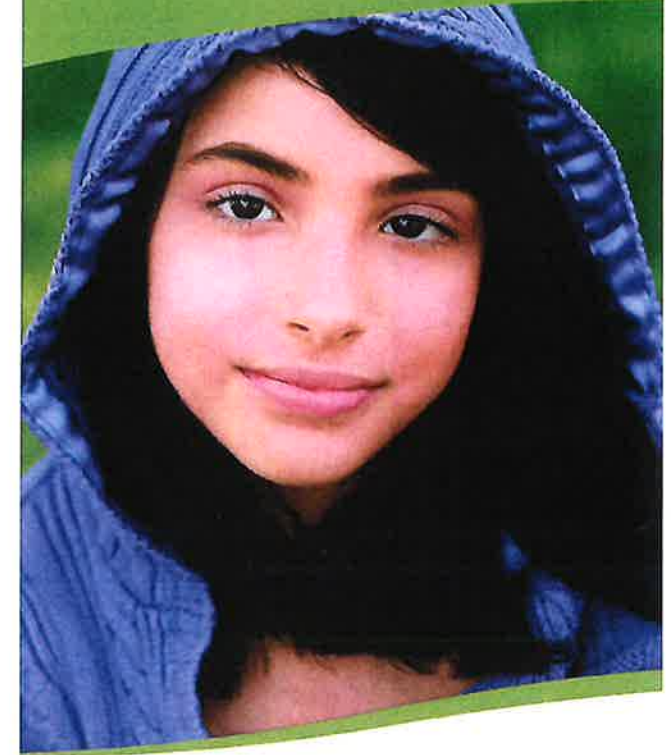

Who We Are

The Center for Youth and Family Solutions (CYFS) through the Comprehensive Community Base Youth Services (CCYBS) offers prevention, diversion, and intervention services for youth and families. The program helps to stabilize families in crisis, prevent juvenile delinquency, and divert youth at risk for involvement in the child welfare or juvenile justice system.

Our Goal:

The goal of the CCBYS program is to ensure the safety of youth and to reunify and stabilize youth with his/her family.

The CCYBS program includes 24 hour crisis response, post-crisis assessment, and case management services that advocate and network for clients. Follow up case management services are provided to help families with appropriate linkages to community service providers. Our ultimate goal is to ensure the safety of youth and to reunify and stabilize youth with their family.

Our Approach:

- An approach to services which enables a family to recognize and build upon their own strengths, to increase the quality of interaction between family members, and to become self-sufficient in the community.
- Comprehensive case management responsibility that includes: needs assessment, services planning, case coordination, service brokerage, aggressive linkages with community resources, monitoring the family's progress toward meeting case goals and objectives, and the development of recommendations for ongoing services, when necessary.
- Caseworkers and advocates work collaboratively with other service providers to promote a wide range of approaches based on the strengths and needs of each individual services or treatment plan.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Station Adjusted (arrested but not referred to court) or placed on probation supervision.
- Juvenile Justice System Referral
- Youth on probation/parole who are high risk of violating probation/parole or re-offending
- Risk-Taking behavior (gang involvement, violence, drugs, etc.)
- Child or sibling of a prisoner- youth who have parents or siblings that are incarcerated.
- Accompanied homeless youth
- Any/all risk levels- youth who present as "medium to high risk" on the Youth Assessment Screening Instrument and require intervention.
- Youth age 10-If provider resources allow and there is a need for such services within the community
- Truancy intervention services
